Remarks from the President

Fall is finally upon us and what a relief it is from the dog days of this summer!

The gallery enjoyed several successes in the last quarter, including improved revenues from increased attendance in both adult and children's art classes. Much credit goes to Susan Sullivan-Tulbach for her untiring efforts to build this important program.

Another highlight was the award of the Williams & Mary President's Award for Community Service to Karen Schwartz for her creation and implementation of the Buddy Art Program. There are only two recipients of this prestigious award each year; one to a student, the other to a staff member. It included a monetary award of \$500 that Karen has donated to support the program going forward. If you haven't done so already, I know you will want to congratulate Karen for this worthy recognition. She has also been nominated for the Alli Awards that will take place on Sunday, November 14th at the American Theater in Hampton.

On Saturday, October 2nd the gallery helped organize a plein air "quick paint" event on DOG Street as part of expanding An Occasion for the Arts to a two-day program. While participation was disappointing, the artists who did attend enjoyed the experience and look forward to the event next year. Equally disappointing was the weather the following day, which dampened attendance and sales at the Art Show, however the gallery had over 200 visitors and enjoyed some sales.

The highlight of the quarter was the most successful 5 X 7: Art On The QT fundraiser at the Community Building. The attendance was great and we are most grateful to all the artists who donated work. A special thanks also to Polly Nunn for the beautiful image she created to promote the event. Many of the well over 100 pieces of artwork were sold. Not only did the event provide significant revenue for

TCAG Member Artists' Web Gallery

There is an annual web fee of \$10 per artist to link from the Web Gallery to the artist's personal website or to a web page in the TCAG Members' Gallery.

If a member artist wants a web page on the TCAG website, there is a one-time set-up fee of \$60 for a page in the web gallery which includes an Artist Statement and/or Bio (500 words max), and up to 3 digital images. The TCAG web page

may include contact information (address, phone, email), and


hyper-links to email and/or a personal web page. There will be an additional fee to edit or update an artist's web

page and a \$15 fee for each additional image.

The Symphonia and the Gallery -A History of Mutual Support and Collaboration



The Williamsburg Symphonia began its 27th season on October 2 with a concert, "Music Under the

Stars," in Merchants Square. Its 2010-2011 season continues with a series of Masterworks concerts performed at the Kimball Theatre and directed by Janna Hymes who returns for her seventh year at the helm.

Inspired collaboration has been a hallmark of arts organizations in the Williamsburg area. One outstanding example of a lucrative partnership between This Century Art Gallery and the Williamsburg Symphonia League was the painted-violins project in 2004. "The Art of Music" was a success on all fronts. Not only was the revenue (split 50:50) impressive, but it provided good publicity for the gallery and the Symphonia and promotion for local artists who crafted and decorated the fifteen beautiful violins presented for raffle and live auction. Note cards of the painted violins are still available for sale by both organizations.

Support of the Symphonia, the gallery and any number of other nonprofit arts organizations are contributing to the cultural fabric of their community. In return, the organizations strive to do their part by uniting in collaborations that make them more efficient, more receptive to their patrons' needs and tastes and more enjoyable for all.
