As the fall approaches, This Century Art Gallery looks forward to participating in a new Art and Tourism Initiative. September has been designated as Arts Month in James City County, Yorktown, and Williamsburg. To attract arts and culture visitors to the Greater Williamsburg area, Terry Buntrock, the Williamsburg Arts Month Coordinator, states that "The region has a vibrant arts community that needs to be showcased as a tourism experience." She has encouraged all area arts organizations to review their existing September events with arts tourism in mind and consider developing new events that could enhance visitor experiences.

The Greater Williamsburg Chamber and Tourism alliance and the three area development authorities are working together to create a marketing campaign that will include a centralized arts calender: www.williamsburgarts.com, television advertising in the greater Washington area, and a focus on art as a theme for convention planners.

The Gallery has several events that will get a marketing boost as a result of this initiative including our September exhibition at the Gallery, numerous arts classes, the annual 5 X 7 Art on the QT and a new workshop on September 17th. The new workshop entitled "Reach the Next Level" will be conducted by Sue Danehy, First Place Winner of the Annual Members' Show. Participants will be bused to visit several area galleries and enjoy beverages. We will coordinate plein air artists for the Williamsburg farmers market.

2011/12 Lecture Series

Lectures will be at the Williamsburg Regional Library and are made possible through the gallery's affiliation with the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts (VMFA) in Richmond.

The first lecture will be on September 26. This will be a presentation on the great Hindu epic poem, the Ramayana. The Ramayana has been passed down for hundreds of generations and its influence can be seen in Indian art, literature, history and even statecraft. This lecture explores Hindu culture by examining the characters of the Ramayana and the choices they make through an investigation of the epic poem and the ways in which the story is told through the visual arts. The presenter will be Dr. Jennifer Foley who is the Paul Mellon Collection Educator at the VMFA.

Additional programs on other topics will be given in October (10th, 24th), November (14th), January (23rd, 30th) and February (20th, 27th). Details on the topics will be communicated via the gallery's monthly E-Newsletter and the winter edition of this newsletter. Please mark your calendars now. All lectures will be on Mondays and will start at 7:30 PM. They will last approximately one hour and refreshments will be served following the presentations.
