Remarks from the President


By now you will have learned that we relocated our Art Education Center from Williamsburg Crossing Shopping Center to 110 Westover Avenue in the city. The new facility includes additional classrooms to expand arts education programs, provide staff offices and eventually feature a small space to display member and student art.

We are the first business to relocate to the Arts District, a project we will continue to monitor. More information is expected once the results of a feasibility study are available. However, we consider this an interim move until we have the resources to build our proposed Community Art Center at Paper Mill Creek on South Henry Street. Nevertheless, recent publicity on the Arts District, the College's Arts Complex and our Arts Center has raised important public awareness of the significance and benefits the arts contribute to the community.

The 2010 Annual Meeting was well attended and provided an opportunity to introduce new Executive Director, Kerry Mellette. Kerry gave an overview of her initial priorities for the gallery that were well received. She expands on these plans in another section. The membership approved a slate of new officers that include Linda Caviness, who replaces Bob Zolad as First Vice President and Barry Hood as the new Treasurer. Other officers were re-elected including myself as President, Darrell Craig as Artistic Director and Sharon Parker as Secretary. We have a strong board, mostly volunteers, who continue to serve with dedication and distinction.

We expect the recent bus trip to the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts in Richmond to see the Picasso exhibit was successful and will encourage us to offer more trips. A possible trip to Washington, DC museums and galleries is being considered and we would appreciate your thoughts on that and other ideas. Please share them with Cindy May (cindy1106@cox.net).

From the Executive Director

Excerpts from remarks made at the January Annual Meeting:



Thank you for giving me the opportunity to serve as your part-time Executive Director. In the short time that I have been serving as your Director, I have been astounded at the amazing amount of work that is accomplished by this organization through its dedicated volunteers, contributors, and part time staff. Your

commitment and passion to your current operations will help us as we strive to reach our future vision to become the Williamsburg Arts Center.

My job is to help move us closer to that vision of being the Williamsburg Arts Center. In the year ahead, I will be focused on several things including; expanding the art education programs through a new facility, marketing our many opportunities to the community, growing the annual campaign, examining board structure, and working in partnership with our vice chair to develop a strategic plan. T his plan is not intended to change the vision but help us look strategically how we can get there in today's changing environment.

More than five years has passed since the feasibility study was started and three years since it was presented to this membership.
